

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE & RESOURCES



This morning, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) announced the second case of coronavirus in the state, both related to travel to other locations.

According to the NCDHHS and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the health risk to the general public in North Carolina from coronavirus disease 2019 (abbreviated COVID-19) remains low at this time.


Explore Asheville staff continue to monitor this developing situation closely and are in regular communication with industry leaders. We will continue to pass along guidance and information from trusted sources.

Common Sense Precautions

NCDHHS encourages people to take common sense precautions to prevent the spread of all infectious diseases.

- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds at a time.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are ill.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Do not reuse tissue after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces that are frequently touched.

These precautions are also helpful in preventing the spread of common illnesses such as influenza.
